

SCRIPT FOR MARPLE NEWTOWN WEATHER AND INFORMATION NET

PRE-NET ANNOUNCEMENT

Good Morning, this is (Call sign). The Marple Newtown Amateur Radio Club's Weather and Information Net is due to start in about two minutes. If you have an urgent need for the W3DI repeaters, or emergency traffic to pass on them before the net begins, please call (Call sign) now.

NET START SCRIPT

Good Morning, this is (Call sign) and this is the Marple Newtown Amateur Radio Club's Weather and Information Net for (Day and Date). This net runs daily starting between 08:25 and 08:30 in the morning and usually continues until there are no more check ins. This net uses the W3DI repeaters located in Newtown Square PA using the frequencies of 147.195 Mhz, with a PL tone of 100Hz ,and 442.25 with a PL tone of 131.8

This is a directed net meaning that all traffic should go through net control. And, if you can refrain from just calling out your call sign and instead wait until check ins are asked for that would be appreciated. Also, if you have a comment or question say the word comment or question and wait to be acknowledged.

This net is open to all licensed amateur radio operators who are within the range of the W3DI repeaters. That range normally being Southeast Pennsylvania, Northeast Maryland, Southern New Jersey, Northern Delaware and parts of New York and with Echo Link any place you have an Internet Connection.

My call sign is (Call sign) and my name is (Name). I am the Net Control Station for today. If you would like to check in, please call (Call sign) now.

NORMAL CALL FOR CHECKINS

CLOSING ANNOUNCEMENT

This has been the Marple Newtown Amateur Radio Club Weather and Information Net for (Day and Date). This net runs daily starting between 8:25 – 8:30 in the morning and usually continues until there are no more check ins. The net uses the W3DI repeaters located in Newtown Square, PA, using the frequencies of 147.195 Mhz, with a PL tone of 100Hz, and 442.25 Mhz with a PL of 131.8.

The net has been open to all licensed amateur radio operators who are within the range of the W3DI repeaters. That range normally being Southeast Pennsylvania, Northeast Maryland, Southern New Jersey, Northern Delaware and parts of New York and with Echo Link, anywhere you might have an Internet connection.
